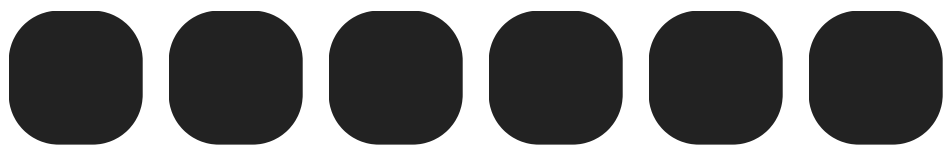

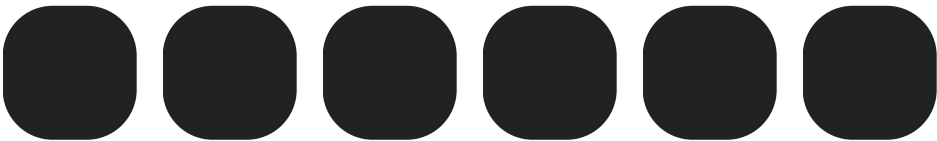

He was preceded in death other than by his parents, by one sister Cathie Jean Green Dennington.

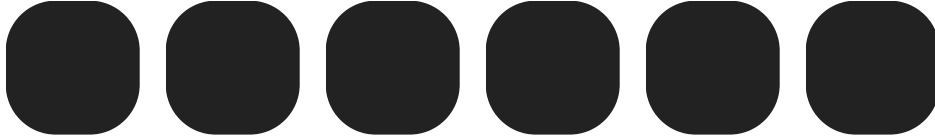

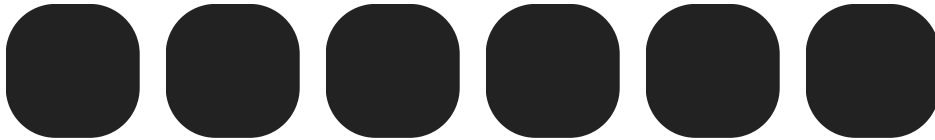
In addition to his father, he was preceded in death by his maternal grandmother, Alma Coffey; and uncle, Steven Coffey.

He was preceded in death by one brother, James Aycock and by one sister, Mary Jane Aycock.

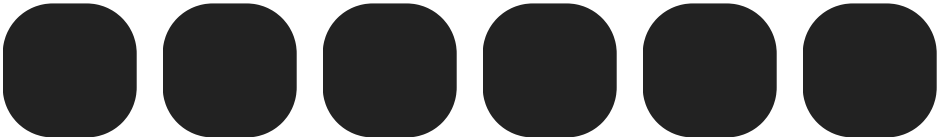
