Bloomfield, Missouri - Paul Martin was presented with a House Resolution for recognition he received as an employee of the Missouri State Veterans Cemetery.

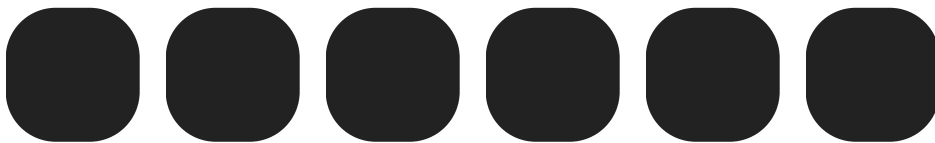

Saint Francis to Host Free Coaches Clinic

SAINT FRANCIS TO HOST FREE COACHES CLINIC

Cape Girardeau, Missouri - Saint Francis Healthcare System will host its annual Coaches Clinic Thursday, September 15, from 8:30 am to 1:30 pm in the Health and Wellness Center – (150 S. Mount Auburn Road – Entrance 8).

Each year, the program focuses on topics relevant to today's coaches and athletes. The clinic's goal is to make coaches more aware of current issues and opportunities, and help them achieve excellence in their programs by keeping their athletes healthy and strong. This year's clinic features former NFL quarterback and current football and baseball coach Jay Schroeder, plus a presentation from Saint Francis orthopedic surgeon James M. Edwards, MD.

Schroeder's NFL career began in 1985 and ended with over 20,000 yards passing and 100 touchdown passes and a .648 winning percentage. draws upon his football experiences to share the importance of leadership and teamwork in business, at home and in the face of adversity. Schroeder also will discuss the importance of today’s athlete maintaining mental and physical health. Dr. Edwards, an orthopedic surgeon at Saint Francis, will share helpful information on injury prevention and management in young athletes, and participate in a question-and-answer session with attendees.

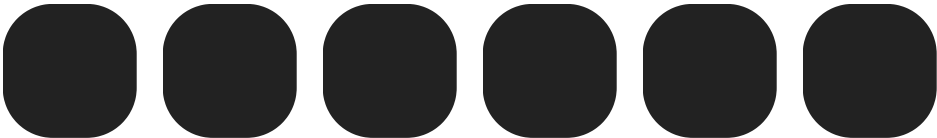
This clinic offering is free, and coaches, athletic trainers, principals and school administrators are encouraged to attend. To register for this event, call 573-331-3996 by September 12.
