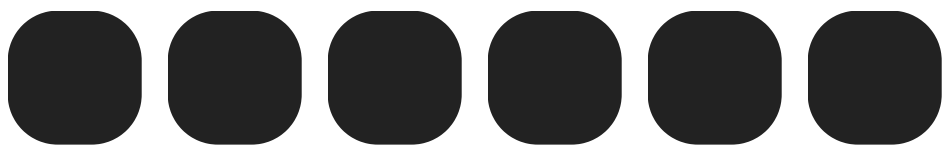
Burial will be in Qulin Cemetery at Qulin, Missouri.

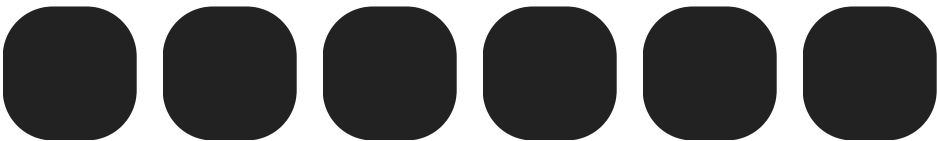

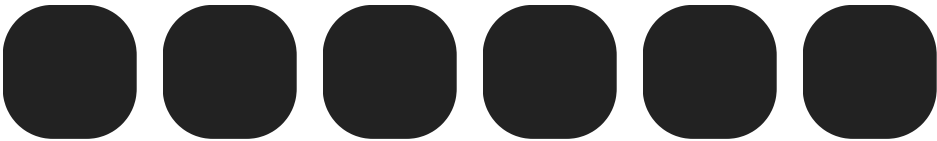
