Nunnlee Funeral Home are in charge of arrangements.

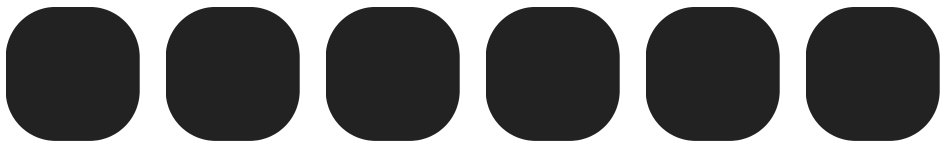

Friends may call at the Rainey Mathis Funeral Home on Friday, October 14, 2016 from 9:30 A.M. until 10:30 A.M.

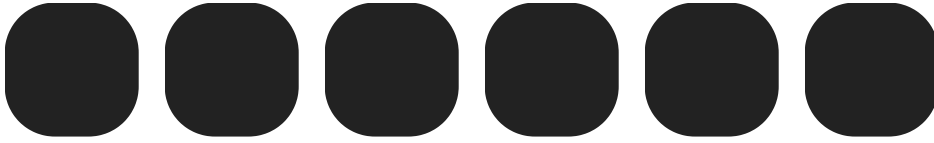

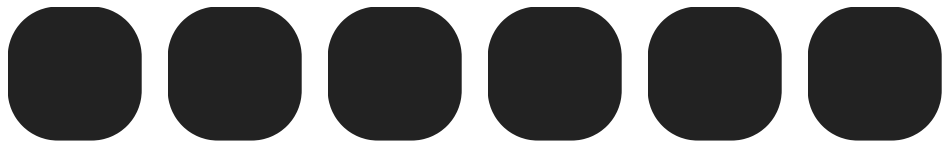
