10:30 A.M., Monday, October 31, 2016.

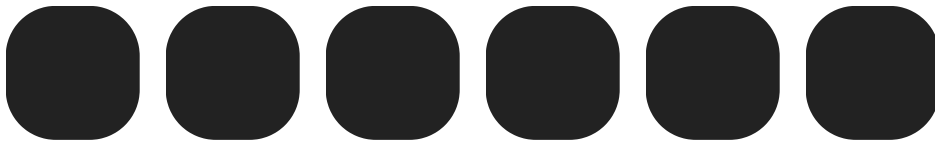
