Friends may call at the Rainey-Mathis Funeral Home in Dexter from 10:00 until 11:00 A.M. Monday, February 6, 2017.

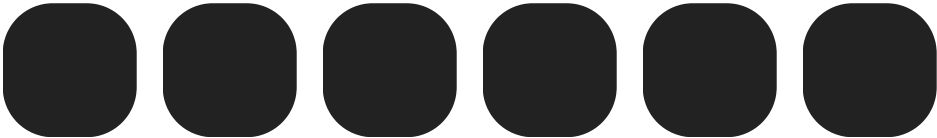
