Friends may call on Monday, April 24, 2017, from 5:00 to 8:00 p.m. at the Watkins & Sons Funeral Home in Dexter.







On February 18, 1964, she married Eulish Eugene "Bud" Scheible. He preceded her in death on February 1, 2008.


