Sikeston earned the #1 seed and has a first round bye.


Notre Dame received the #2 seed and will play #7 Fredericktown on May 13th at 9 a.m.

Senath-Hornersville seeded #3 will play #6 seeded Bloomfield on May 13th at noon.


South Pemiscot seeded #2 will play #7 seeded Hayti on May 13th at 2 p.m.

6th, 7th, and 8th grade camp will be 1:00 p.m. - 3:00 p.m. Tuesday, Wednesday, Thursday.


