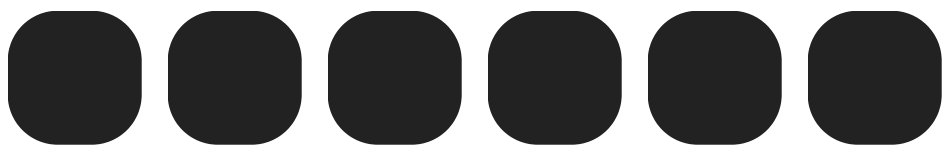

Friends may call at the Rainey-Mathis Funeral Home in Dexter from 12:00 until 2:00 P.M. Wednesday, November 15, 2017.

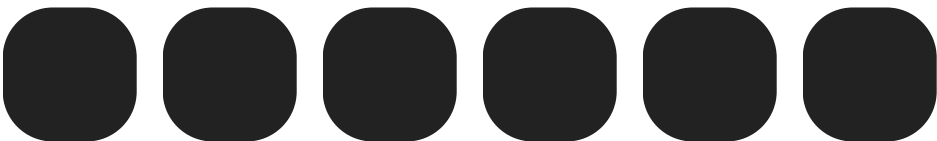

She was preceded in death by her parents and one brother: Ron McMillian

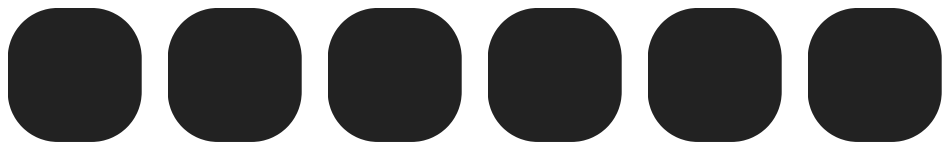
