of Florida; and her dog, Lucy of Bloomfield, MO. She was preceded in death by her brother Bruce Fulkerson.

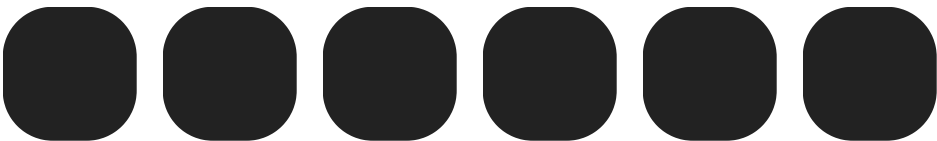
Her family will be privately celebrating her life by spreading her ashes at Long Beach, WA in March.
