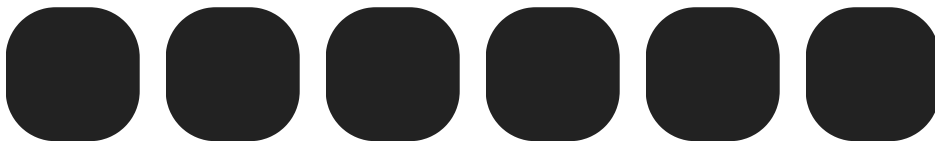

Funeral Services will then be conducted at Rainey-Mathis Funeral Home in Bernie at 10:30 A.M.

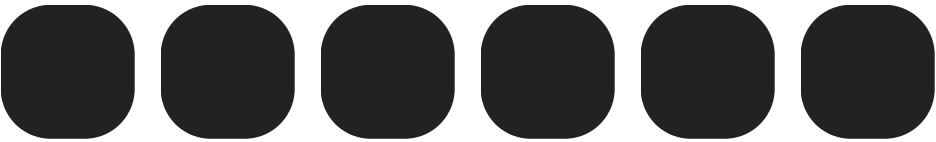

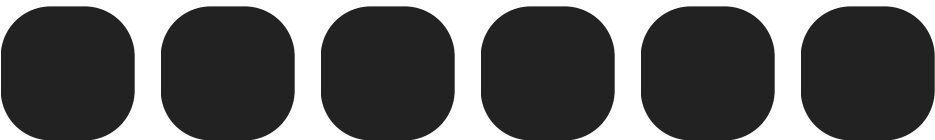
