She was a member of Crowley Ridge Mennonite Church where she faithfully attended while health permitted.

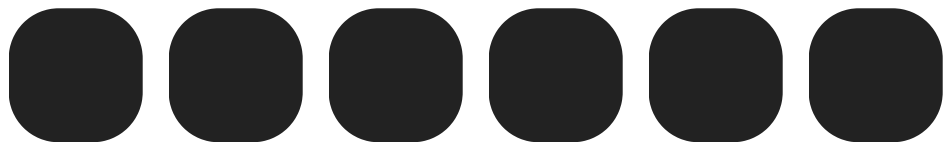

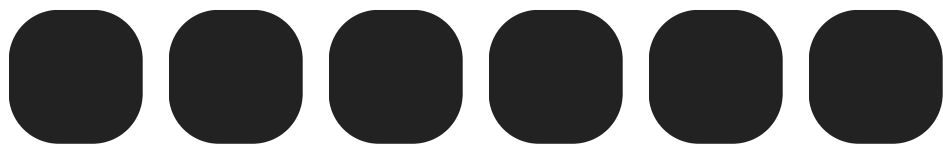
