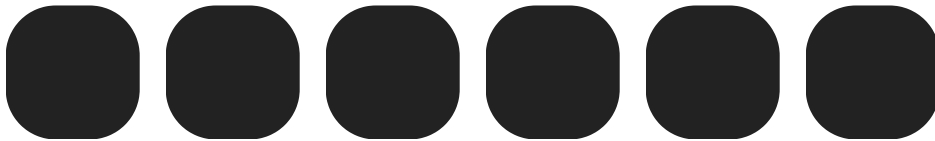

house at 4:00 P.M., Sharing of Memories at 5:00 P.M. and Fellowship at 6:00 P.M.

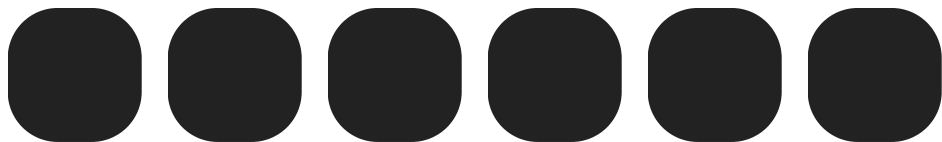
