Besides his parents, he was preceded in death by one brother, Greg Turner and by sister, Misty Sholl.

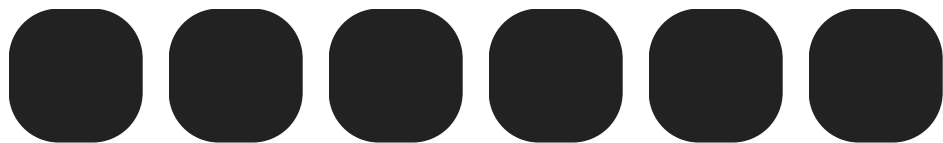
