resides in Wappapello alongside their daughters and son-in-law, Casey.

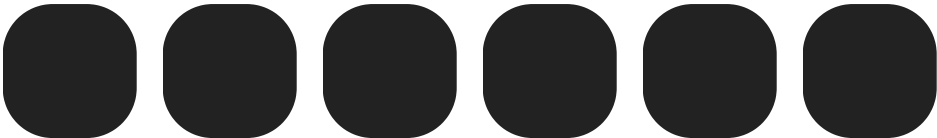
