Friends may call at the Rainey-Mathis Funeral Home in Dexter on Thursday, November 1, 2018 from 12:00 noon to 2:00 PM.

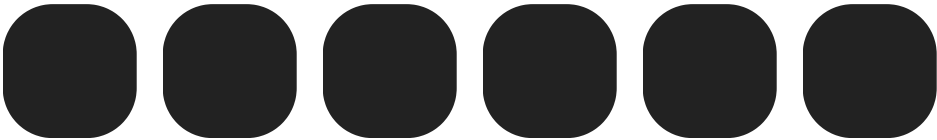
