In addition to his parents, he was preceded in death by one brother Michael Cox.

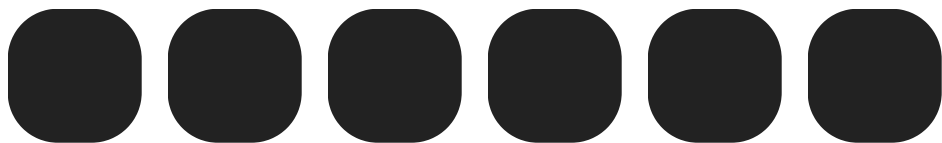
