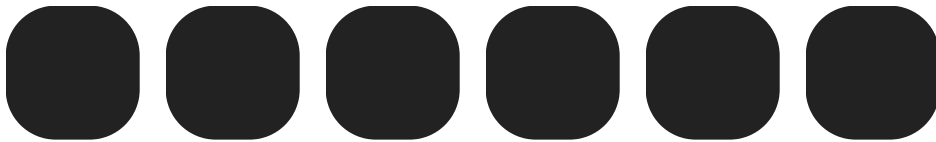

Funeral Services will then be conducted on Monday, December 10, 2018 at 10:00a.m. in the Rainey-Mathis Funeral Chapel in Dexter.

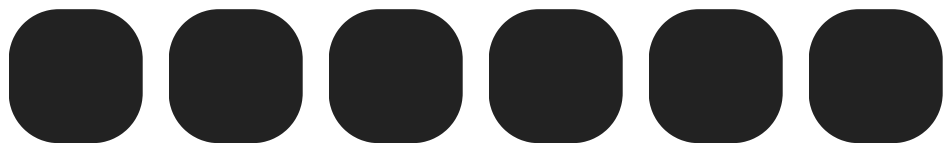
