He was united in marriage to Judy Cox in Dexter, Missouri on August 10, 1958. Mrs. Perkins survives in their home in Bernie.

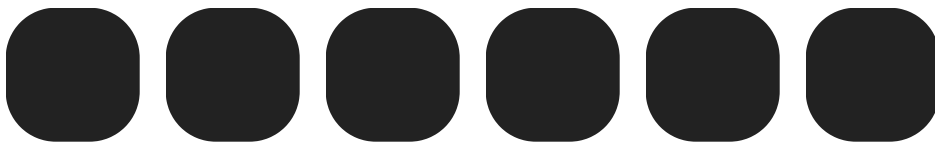
