Alice Fowler officiating. Interment will follow in the Dexter Cemetery.

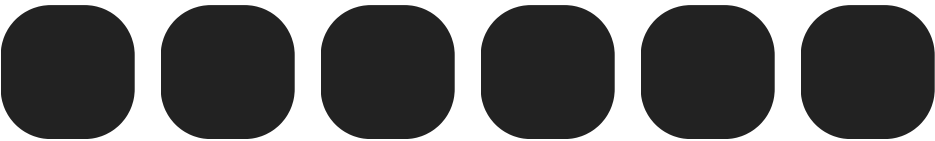

Funeral services will then be conducted at 2:00 P.M. in the Rainey-Mathis Funeral Chapel with Allen Laszewski officiating.

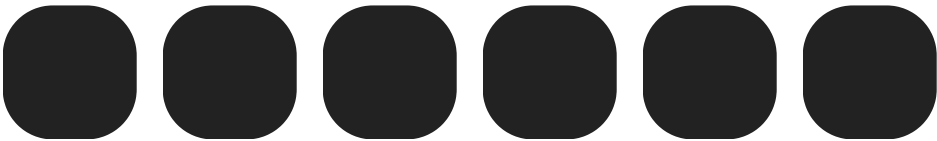
