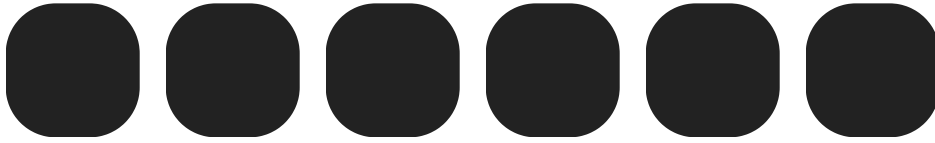

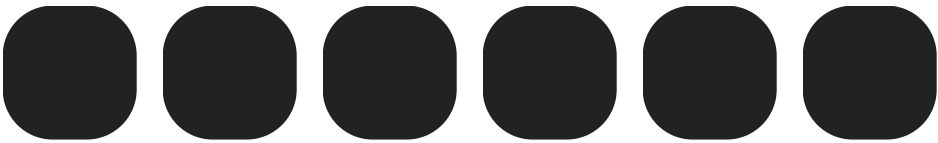
Besides his wife, he is preceded in death by, one son, David Bird.
