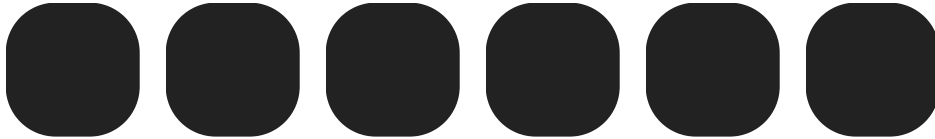
On November 17, 1951, she was married to James C. "Jack" Ward. He preceded her in death on December 25, 2000.

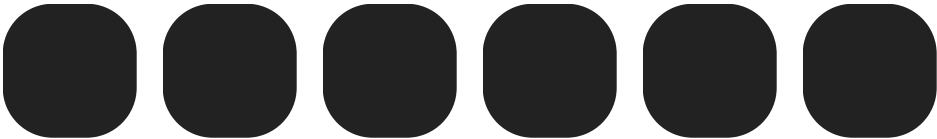
A private memorial service will be planned at a later time. In lieu of flowers, memorial contributions may be made to St. Jude.

Visitation will be held on Tuesday, January 7, 2020 from 5:00 to 8:00 pm. at the Watkins & Sons Funeral Home.

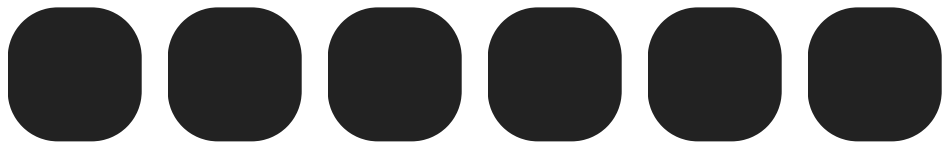

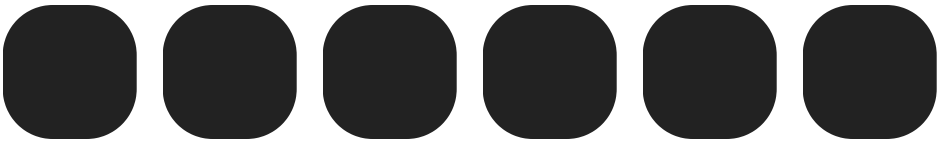

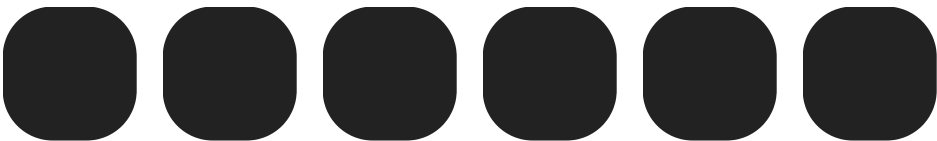
