



Visitation will be held from 10:00 until 2:00 on Saturday, February 8, 2020 at the Amick-Burnett Funeral Home in Oran.


Funeral services will then be conducted on Saturday at 2:00 P.M. with Rev. Jim Matthews officiating.

grandchildren and two great-grandchildren; Survived by aunts, cousins, and friends.


