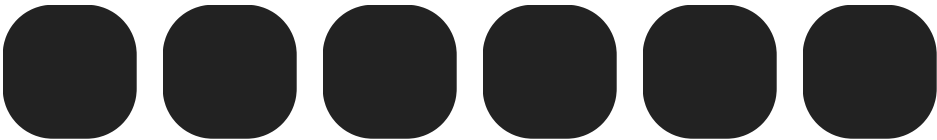
A private, family only, funeral service will be conducted at North Antioch Cemetery on Tuesday, April 28, 2020, directed by Ronnie Stevens.

How quietly you tiptoed into our world, almost silently, only for a moment you stayed . . . but what an imprint your footprints have left upon our hearts.

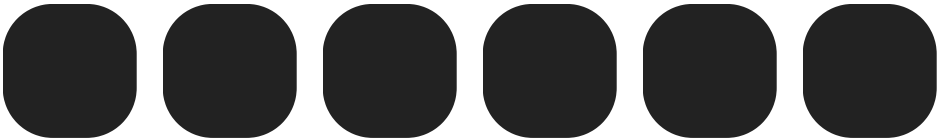

A private, family only, funeral service will be conducted at Mathis Funeral Home in Dexter on April 21, 2020. Interment will follow in the Dexter Cemetery.

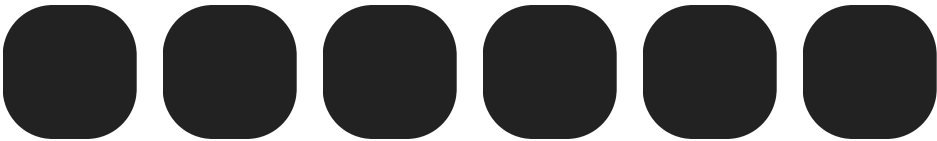
