The family requests that everyone wear facial coverings.

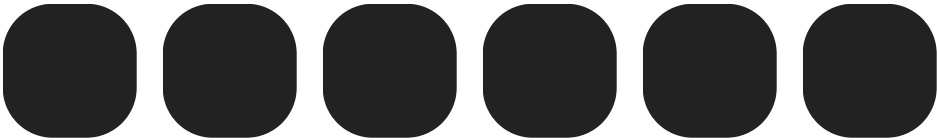

Other than by her husband and parents, she was preceded in death by her sister, Tammie McNeely.

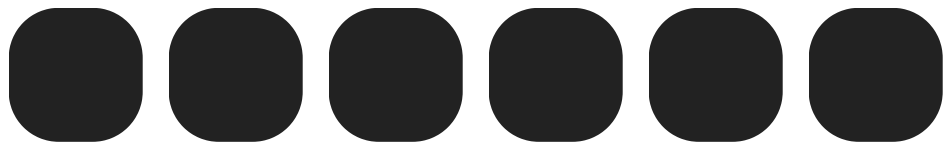
