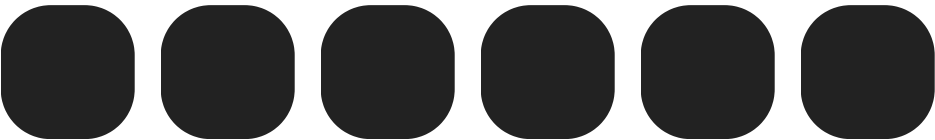

Graveside services will be conducted at Bethany Cemetery, Sunday, November 8, 2020 starting at 1:30 P.M.

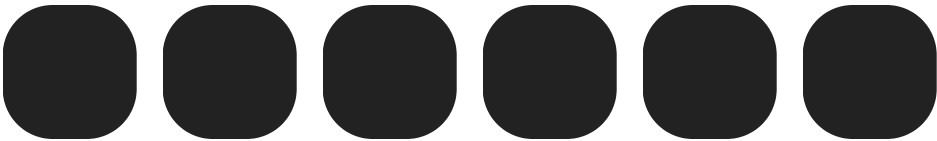

A private graveside service is planned for immediate family members.

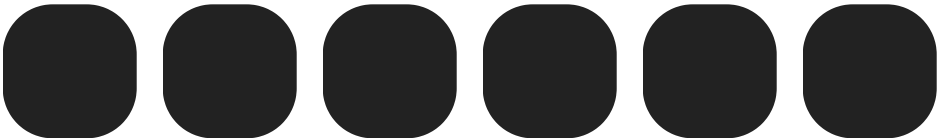
