Visitation will be held at Mathis Funeral Home in Dexter on Friday, May 7, 2021 from 11:00 a.m. to 1:00 p.m.

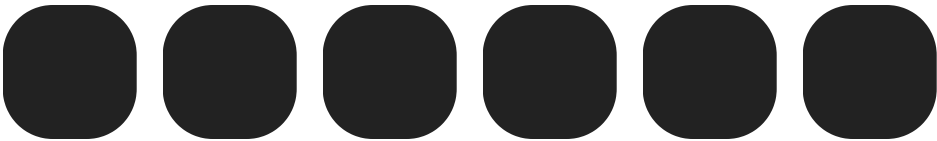

Funeral services will then be conducted in the Mathis Funeral Chapel on Saturday, May 22, 2021 at 11:00 a.m.

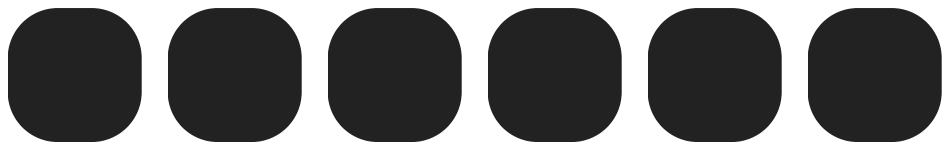

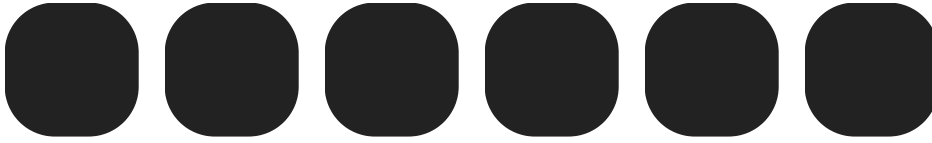

Other than by his parents, he was preceded in death by his brother, Robert Bishop.

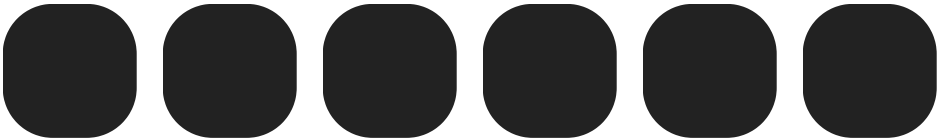
Mr. Bishop will be interred at the Missouri State Veterans Cemetery in Bloomfield, at a later date.

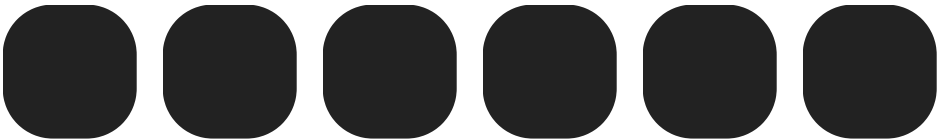
