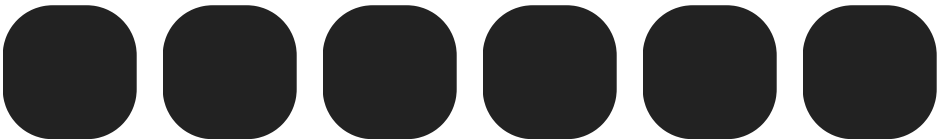
Other than by her husband and parents, she was preceded in death by her brother, Elvis Lee Layton, and by her sister, Carmella Layton.

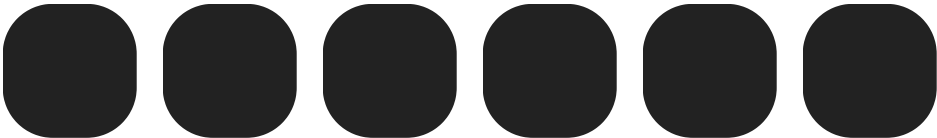
Graveside Services to be held on Thursday May 20, 2021 at 1:00 p.m. with Pastor Roy Sherfield of Dexter, Missouri officiating.
