The visitation will be held Tuesday, June 29, 2021 from 12:00 p.m. to 1:00 p.m. at Morgan Funeral Chapel in Advance.

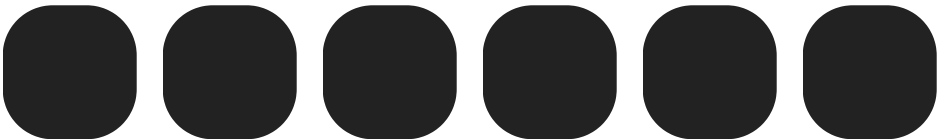

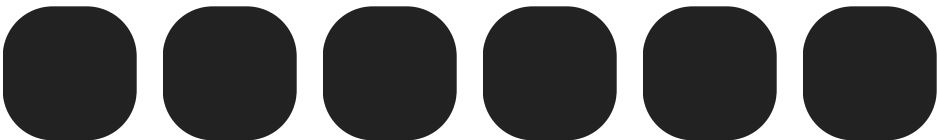
