Funeral services will then be conducted in the Mathis Funeral Home Chapel on Thursday, February 17, 2022, at 10:00 a.m.





Funeral services will then be conducted in the Mathis Funeral Home Chapel on Friday, February 18, 2022, at 11:00 a.m.


