No services are currently planned.

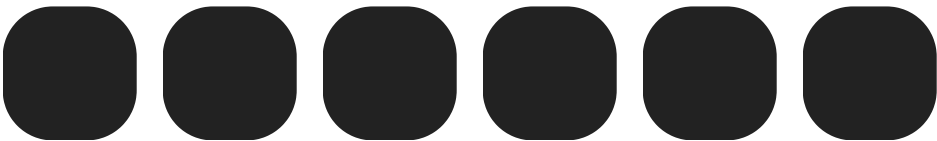

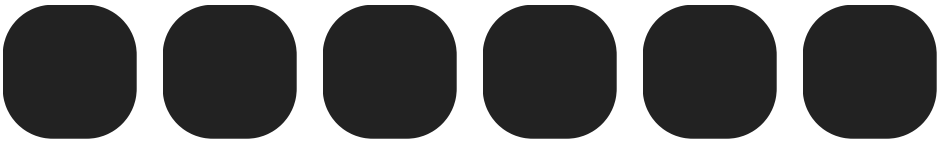
Celebration of David’s life will be held on July 4th on the Farm at Cross Creek in Kingston, TN.

Other than by her parents, she was preceded in death by her son-in-law, Ben Kruse.

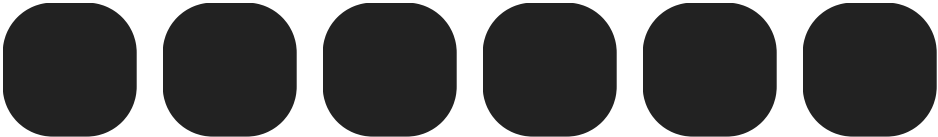
Visitation will be held at Mathis Funeral Home in Dexter on Thursday, April 21, 2022, from 5:00 p.m. to 8:00 p.m.
