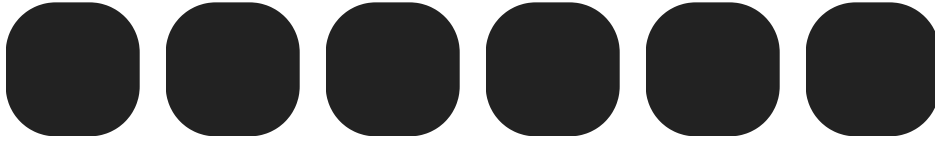
Other than by her parents, she was preceded in death by two brothers, Wayne Patterson and Robert Patterson, and by her sister, Mildred Christine Rymann.

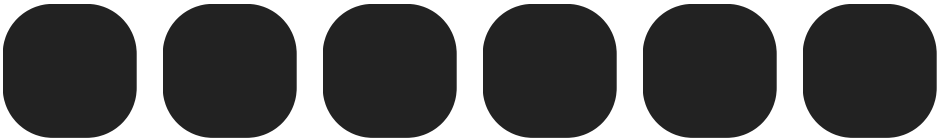
