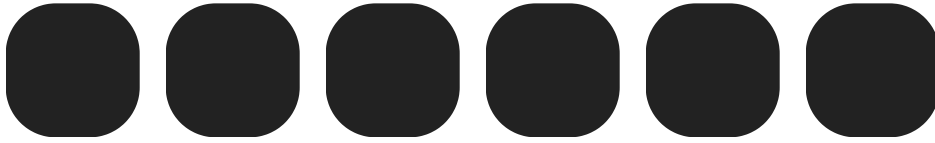
Visitation will be held at Mathis Funeral Home in Dexter on Thursday, April 6, 2023 from 10:00 a.m. until 11:00 a.m.

He was preceded in death other than by his parents, by one sister, Gloria Vancil.

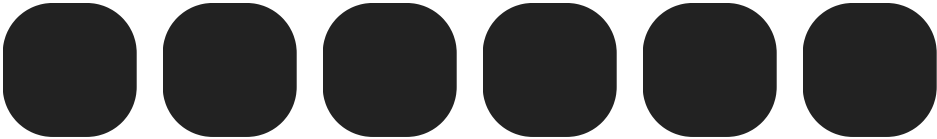
Friends may call at Mathis Funeral Home in Bernie, Missouri on Thursday, April 6, 2023 from 10:00 AM until 12:00 PM.

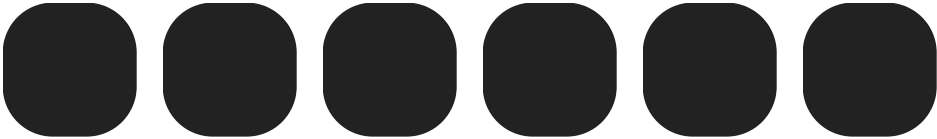
Other than by his parents and wife, he was preceded in death by his sister and brother-in-law, Verneta and Harold Fleming.

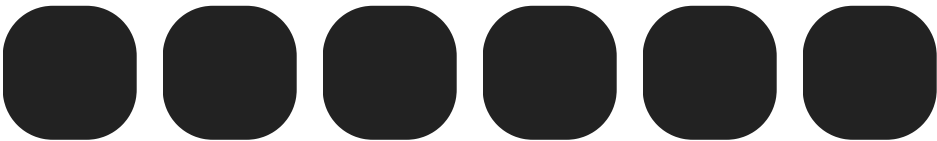

He was preceded in death by his parents; his wife; three brothers Jerry, Jim and Eddie Mann.

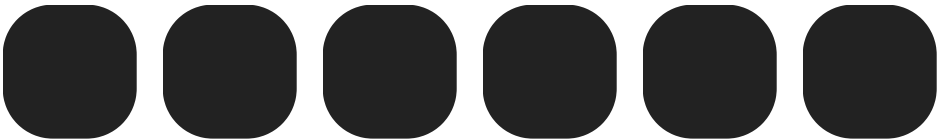
