Shirley also counts as her blessings fourteen grandchildren and nine great-grandchildren.

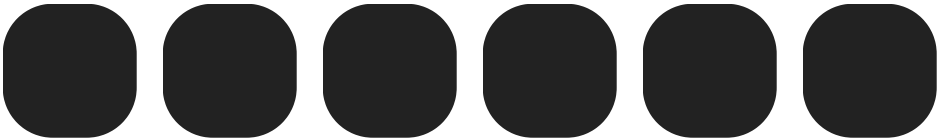

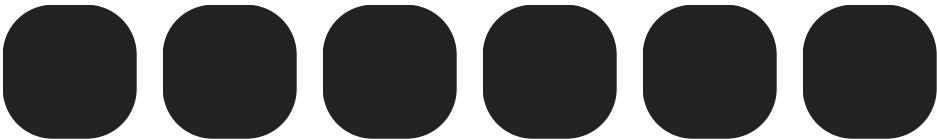
