Visitation services to honor Randy's life will be held on Friday, March 8, 2024, from 12:00 PM

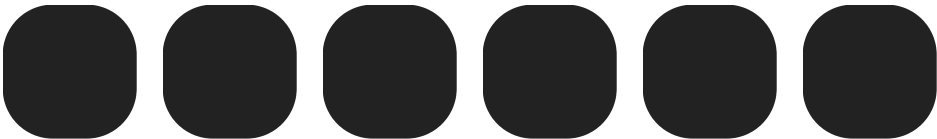
to 2:00 PM at Watkins Funeral Homes in Dexter. A Memorial Service will follow at the same location from 2:00 PM.

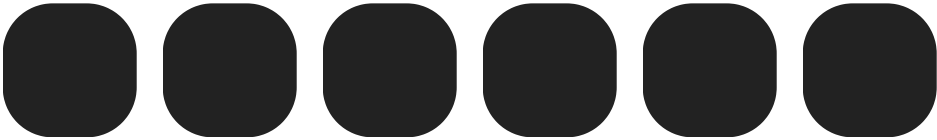

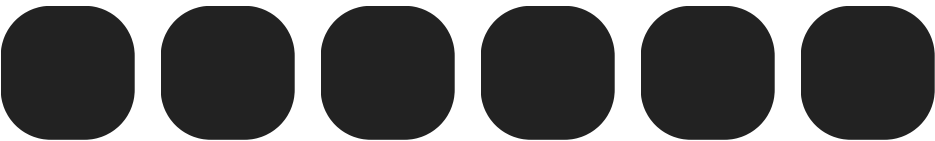

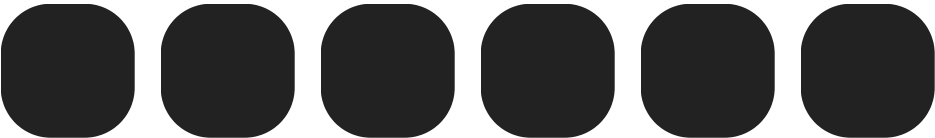
