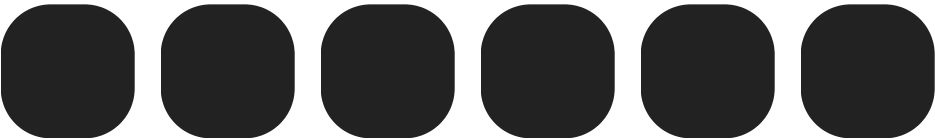
Other than by her parents, she was preceded in death by her son, Jason Vaughn, and by her brother, Charles Hall.

His freshman year, he began attending Bloomfield High School and was a graduate of the class of 1954. 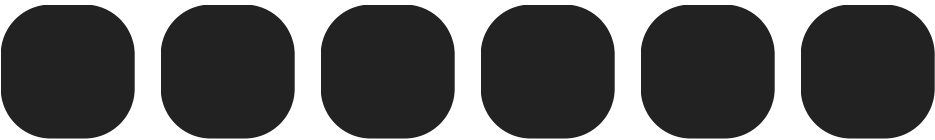

Other than by his parents, he was preceded in death by five brothers: Otis, Edgar (Dean), Oral, Joe, and John (Jay).

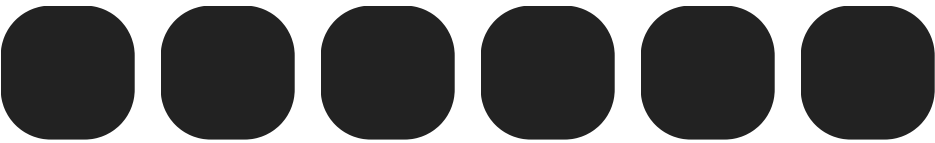

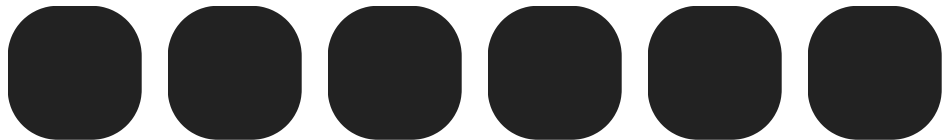
