Other than by his parents, he was preceded in death by his sister, Linda Howard.

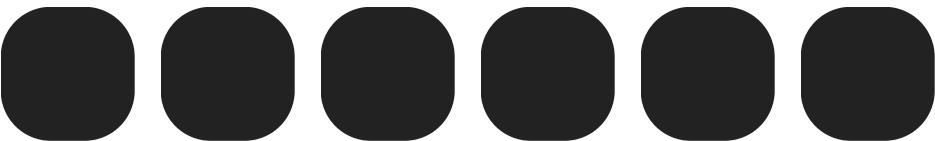

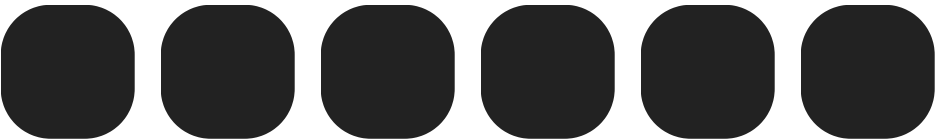

Family and friends are invited to pay their respects at Watkins Funeral Homes in Dexter, Missouri.

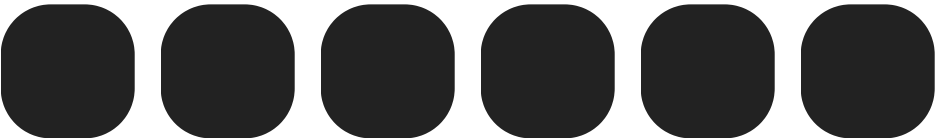
