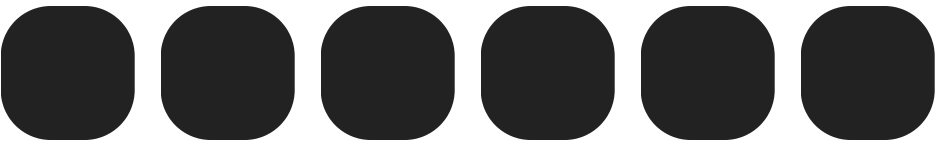

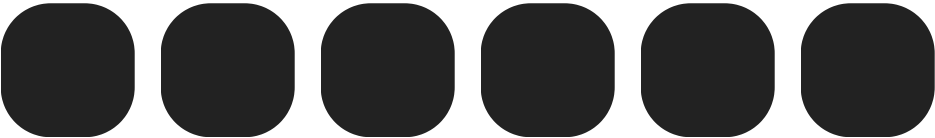
Missouri; and by two grandchildren, Zayne Gillespie and Brayden Gillespie.

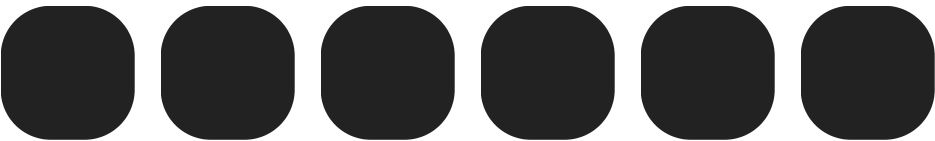

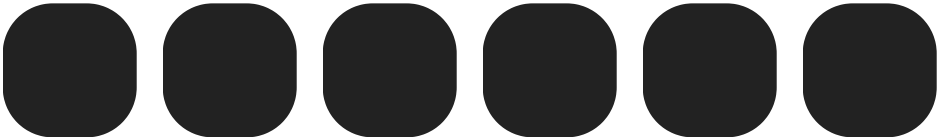
