Do you have a computer, a DVR or a copier you want to get rid of? The Bootheel Solid Waste Management District is sponsoring a recycling day on Thursday, October 10.

People can discard unwanted electronic equipment. The main drop off site is at the Bootheel Regional Planning Commission, 105 E. North Main in Dexter, MO (the old Armory building).

For the City of Puxico, Puxico Mayor Rick McLean has stated that if the citizens of Puxico wish to drop off items to be recycled at Puxico City Hall, the City will transport the items to the recycling site in Dexter.

People may drop off any unwanted equipment at Puxico City Hall the Friday evening, October 4, through Thursday morning, October 10 (until noon).

There will be a trailer placed on the City Hall parking lot for these items. The trailer will be taken to Dexter at noon on October 10. If you have any questions concerning this, please contact City Hall, 573-222-3162.

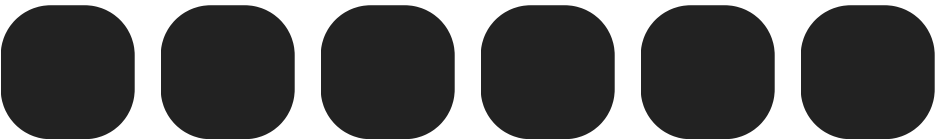
The following is a list of items that can be dropped off for recycling: computer monitors, servers, desktop PC's, laptops, netbooks, Macs, tablets, keyboards, mice, speakers, modems, routers, cables, software, all components and accessories, printers, copiers, scanners, faxes, ink/toner cartridges, Blu-ray, HD DVD, DVD, laserdisc, VHS, Betamax, DVR's, cable and satellite receivers, digital and film cameras, audio receivers, amplifiers,

speakers, MP3 players, CD players, cassette decks, turntables, 8-track, boomboxes, microphones, mixers, rack equipment, and DAW.

Make Sure Your Child is in the Right Seat

Every year, the U.S. Department of Transportation's National Highway Traffic Safety Administration (NHTSA) Region 7, which includes Arkansas, Iowa, Kansas, Missouri, and Nebraska, partners with local communities to hold Child Passenger Safety Week, which runs this year from September 15-21.

The annual safety week ends with National Seat Check Saturday (September 21), a day for parents and caregivers to receive free instruction on how to correctly install and use the right car seats for their children. There are many locations throughout the region that will be offering free car seat inspections by certified Child Passenger Safety Technicians. The Stoddard County Health Department and the Stoddard County Ambulance Department can check your car seat.

Technicians will check car seats, let caregivers know if their children are in the right seats for their ages and sizes, and show them how to install the right seats correctly.

“Unfortunately, many parents are overconfident about their car seats,” said Regional Administrator Susan DeCourcy. “They think they are protecting their kids, but statistically, nearly half of car seats are either the wrong seat for the child’s age and size, or the seats are installed incorrectly. That puts children at risk.”

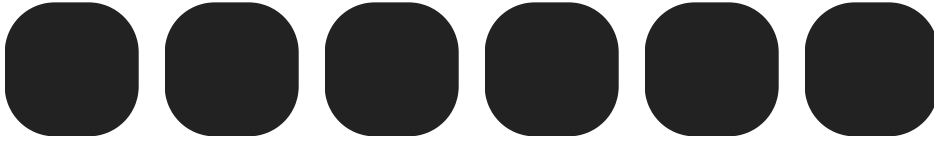
According to NHTSA, motor vehicle crashes are a leading cause of death for children. Every day in 2022, an average of three children 13 and younger were killed in crashes, and another 429 were injured. “We know parents love their kids,” added DeCourcy, “so they’ll do everything in their power to protect them. An easy way to do that is to double-check their car seats — it’s worth making sure.”

In 2022, almost half (49%) of the children killed while riding in light pickup trucks were unrestrained, followed by SUVs (38%), passenger cars (34%), and vans (12%). NHTSA wants caregivers to know that it’s never safe to ride unbuckled in a passenger vehicle — no matter how short the trip or how big the vehicle. Bigger vehicles don’t protect child passengers, but properly used car seats, booster seats, and seat belts do.

When it comes to child passengers, there is a correctly sized seat for every age and developmental stage — from infants to teens. Whether it’s a rear-facing car seat, a forward-facing car seat installed with a tether, a booster seat, or a seat belt, a certified Child Passenger Safety Technician can put parents’ minds at ease by discussing correct car seat selection and showing them how to correctly install that seat in their vehicle. Children should stay in each seat and position until they outgrow those limits, and it’s important for all children under 13 to ride in the back seat.

Weather permitting, work will take place Monday, Sept. 16 through Tuesday, Sept. 17 from 7 a.m. to 4 p.m. daily.

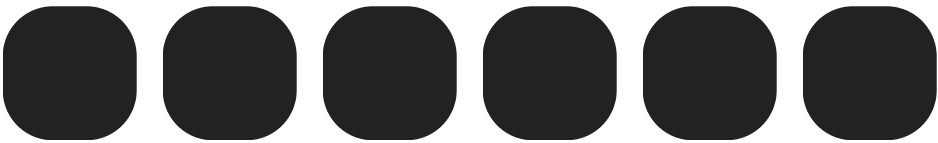
The work zone will be marked with signs. Motorists are urged to use extreme caution while traveling near the area.

As a part of the City-Wide Cleanup, the city trash service, Henson Trash, will set up a dumpster on the west side of the City Hall parking lot.

Citizens of Puxico may discard bulk trash (no household trash) for the City-Wide Cleanup in this

dumpster, including basically anything out of the house that is in disrepair, such as couches, computers, chairs, televisions, dressers, commodes, and small appliances. There will be no door-to-door pickup of bulk trash.

Anyone who brings items to be dumped must show proof of residence in the City, such as a driver's license or a utility bill with name and address.

Items that cannot be put in the dumpster include

+ yard waste, such as straw, grass, dirt, leaves, and railroad ties

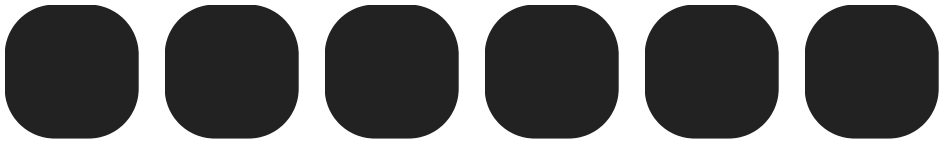
+ construction materials

+ hazardous or infectious materials, such as tires, batteries, motor oil, radiator fluid, medical waste, and paint
