Other than by her husband and parents, she was preceded in death by her brother, Darrell Denny Willis.

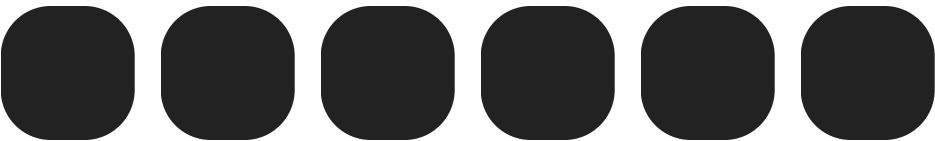
