In addition to her parents, she was also preceded in death by one brother-in-law: Chuck Stewart.

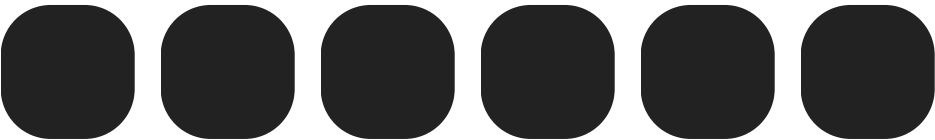
