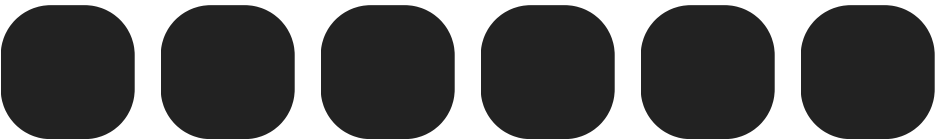
Mitchell McLard, and JR McLard and by her sister, Francis McLard.

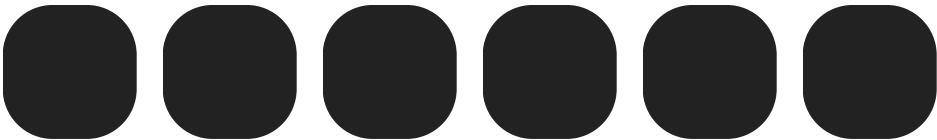
