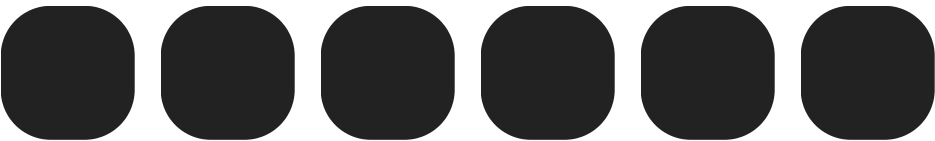

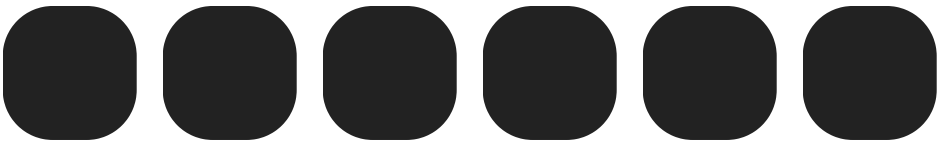

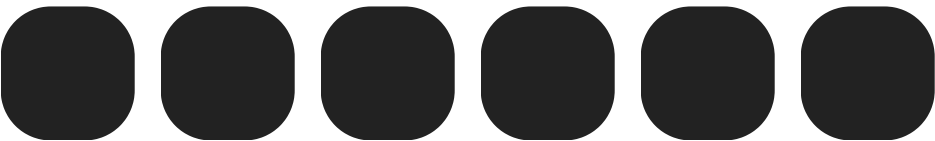
where she can be remembered with love.

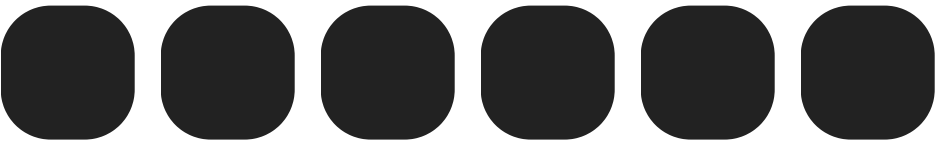
