On December 1, 1960, in St. Louis, Missouri, she was united in marriage to Tom James - her best friend for over 60 years. Tom survives at their home in Dexter.




Other than by his parents, he was preceded in death by his brother, David Dick; and by his sisters, Sheila LePlant and Wanda Pentland.

She was preceded in death by her parents Charles and Mildred Kennemore of Osceola and her brother Charles Richard "Dickie" Kennemore also of Osceola.


A visitation will be held Tuesday, November 12, from 5:00 to 7:00 p.m. at Ponder Funeral Home in Sikeston, Missouri.

Visitation will be held Thursday, November 14, from 11:00 a.m. until time of funeral services at 1:00 p.m. at Ponder Funeral Home.


Interment will be in the Oak Ridge Cemetery at Zadock, MO.
