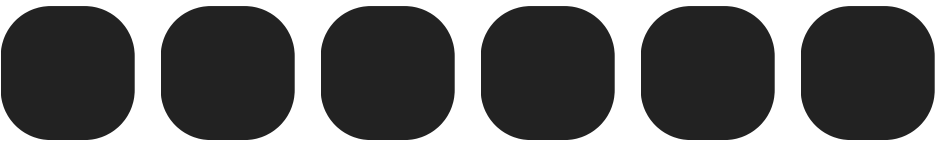
Graveside services will be held at Hagy Cemetery in Dexter on Friday, January 31, 2025, at 1:00 p.m.

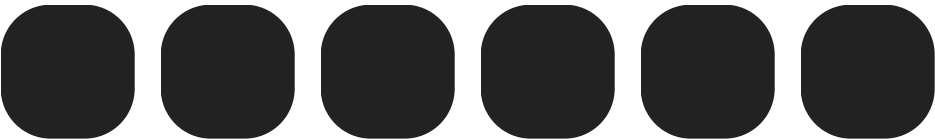

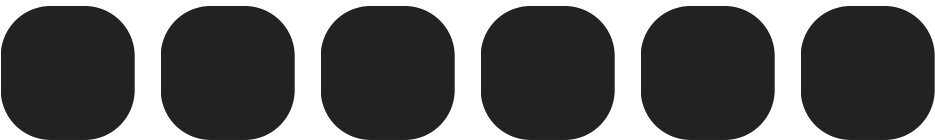
