Bradshaw, Ralph Bradshaw III, Lucius Bradshaw, and Tobias Lamb.

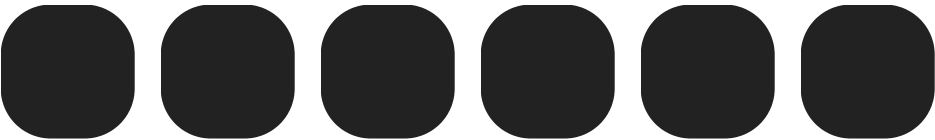

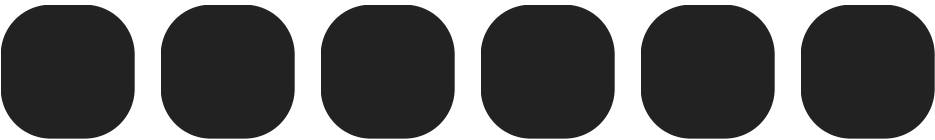
Services will be held at the Missouri State Veterans Cemetery in Bloomfield at a later date with Chaplain Eric Laffoon officiating.
