On August 24, 1958 she was united in marriage to Ernest "Bo" Brock in Clarkton, Missouri. Mr. Brock survives of the home in Scott City.




Other than by his parents, he was preceded in death by his brother, Tony J. Haynes; and by two sisters, Shelby Lewis and Thelma Colbert.
